



MINISTER'S MUSINGS

Ending Well Seminars

“Religion is the human response to the dual reality of being alive and having to die.” So said the Rev. Forrest Church, one of our most prolific, contemporary UU ministers. For three weeks in May, we will be exploring this dual reality of living with the knowledge of death. There will be three sessions in the “Ending Well” seminar series. One session will deal with the legal issues of preparing for death; one session will deal with end-of-life issues from the perspective of hospice and medical decisions we may need to face; and one session will deal with memorializing and grieving. The exact order of the sessions has not been finalized as I am still working on arranging for guest speakers. Attendance at all three sessions is not required for participation, though it would be helpful if people would let me know if they are planning to attend so we can plan accordingly for space needs. The seminars will take place the first three Tuesday evenings of May (5/5, 5/12, and 5/19). Please check the UUSO website or the UUSO chat for the exact location (which will be determined by the number of participants we need to accommodate).

Sermon Discussion

UUSO, as we say every Sunday morning, is an active community with lots of opportunities to get involved. While this is good for us and a sign of a healthy congregation, it does make scheduling things a bit of a challenge sometimes. Scheduling the first in what I hope will be a monthly series of sermon discussions after the worship services on Sunday morning has proven to be quite difficult. My first attempt was thwarted by a previously scheduled engagement with our COAST group (which was a great deal of fun). The second attempt, scheduled for this upcoming Sunday, is in conflict with an important Finance Committee meeting—where we will be finalizing the proposed budget for the annual congregational meeting. At this point, I'm afraid this part of our Spiritual Exploration program will have to wait until the summer worship calendar.

Child Dedication

It is our practice, here at the Unitarian Universalist Society of Oneonta, to offer the rite of Child Dedication twice a year, on Mother's Day and near Thanksgiving. Mother's Day is May 10, this year. The Child Dedication is a rite of passage where we officially recognize a child as a part of this beloved community and extend the blessing and commitment of the congregation to the support and welfare of the child and his or her family. If you would like your child to be dedicated this Mother's Day, please let me know.

The Board of Trustees had a long and productive April meeting. Actions taken include:

- Approved posting UUSO Bylaws, Annual Report and Long Range Plan on the UUSO website;
- Approved creation of a secure area on the website to post the Annual Budget and summary of minutes of regular Board meetings;
- Approved creation of a searchable data base in a secured area for members and friends to look up addresses, phone numbers, and email addresses of adult members who choose to be listed;
- Approved placing and activating a “Donate Here” button on the web page;
- Accepted with enthusiasm a new statement of purpose and mission for the Committee on Ministry;
- Approved a request from the Finance Committee to bring together a working group to explore avenues for planned giving through an endowment process.

Highlights of reports from various committees:

The Stewardship campaign, following phone calls which elicited generous donations, has reached our goal... The Properties Committee is working toward replacing the marquee at Chapin Memorial and expects to have a new hand railing completed at the Olympia Brown House... Fundraising is seeking a new coordinator for UUSO fundraising events... Social Action Committee is sponsoring a day for a community clothes program at Chapin Memorial, working with a group organized by a Methodist church in Binghamton.

Our next regular meeting is May 20, 6:30 pm, in Chapin Memorial. As always, members are welcome to observe. If you have an item that the Board needs to address, please let me know, or stop by the Sounding Board on Sunday, May 17, and speak with Trustees Amy Forster Rothbart and Virgil Briggs and ask to be on the agenda. A reminder that the Sounding Board is available during the Social Hour on the Sunday before regular Board meetings as a way for you to let the Board know about your concerns, ideas, hopes, and vision for UUSO.

SOLARIZE THE SOUTHERN TIER

Solarize the Southern Tier is currently giving a series of free public informational presentations around our area, seeking to double the number of solar PV installations across five counties—Otsego, Delaware, Chenango, Broome, and Tioga. If you missed the two previous local ones and would like to find out more about solar possibilities for your home or small business, the next Otsego County presentation will take place this week on Thursday, April 30, from 6 to 8 pm in the UUSO sanctuary. Free refreshments too. There will also be one in Otego on May 12. Solarize the Southern Tier is a volunteer-driven grassroots campaign from the non-profit Southern Tier Solar Works. These events feature information on costs and capabilities of solar in New York, detailing program and NYSERDA incentives, and include handouts with installation costs. Three partner installers, who have completed an RFP process, attend every event to answer questions and sign up any interested people for free assessments. In mid-May, everyone who has signed up for solar will be invited to a session focusing on financing options. For further info, visit www.southerntiersolarworks.org. Many of us adults were moved to tears just watching them practice. I felt like I was already attending a joyful and spirit-full service and it wasn’t even Sunday morning yet!

One of the teachers told me she overheard a conversation between two students after the Sunday service saying, “I really like coming to church!” and “Me too!” I think that about says it all.


