

BICENTENNIAL OF REV. CHAPIN'S BIRTH

This month marks the bicentennial of the birth of Rev. Edwin Hubbel Chapin. Chapin was born in Union Village, now the village of Nassau, in Rensselaer County, NY, on December 29, 1814. He converted to Universalism as a young man and became a minister in 1838. His first church was the Independent Christian Church of Richmond, Virginia, composed of both Unitarians and Universalists. After a stint at Hosea Ballou's church in the Boston area, he was named pastor at New York City's Fourth Universalist Church in 1848, where he remained for 42 years. He was known for his oratory and traveled widely. He is thought to have made several visits to Oneonta, and gave the dedication in 1879 for the first Universalist church here. It was his last dedication, for he died the following year on December 26, 1880. The Oneonta church was then named Chapin Memorial, as was our current church on its dedication in 1894.

The UUSO is observing Rev. Chapin's 200th birthday with a special service on Sunday, December 21. The milestone will also be marked in other ways, including quotes by Chapin for the Wayside Pulpit and placing Chapin's portrait and his biography in a prominent spot in the sanctuary. Thanks to Cynthia Squires for pointing out the upcoming birthday several months ago and to Deb Bruce and Prue Stelling for helping with the plans for the observance; also acknowledgments to former UUSO member June Edwards, who wrote the biography of Chapin in the Dictionary of Unitarian and Universalist Biography, an on-line resource of the Unitarian Universalist History & Heritage Society. —Bob Brzozowski, UUSO Historian

The Holiday Season is upon us! Many families and individuals engage in a cornucopia of celebrations. Others find this to be a time of introspection and deep quiet while waiting for the return of the sun. It can be a stressful time as well. However you experience this time of year, it can be brightened by taking advantage of opportunities to reach out to help others in our community as well as in our wider world. Our UUSO community offers many such opportunities. I would especially like to point these out as something for families with children and youth to do together as part of their holiday experiences.

Your family can provide part of the holiday celebration for three local families that UUSO has "adopted" who would otherwise not be able to have gifts this season. There is a small tree in the back of the sanctuary decorated with gift tags that describe the person needing a gift and offer some gift suggestions. I know that UUSO children would love to pick a tag and help find a gift to give. The tags will be on the tree on December 7 with gifts to be returned to the tree on December 14 in time for it to be delivered to the family on December 18.

You will also find a "Mitten Basket" near this tree in the back of the sanctuary. This is an annual tradition of the UUSO Religious Education Program where we collect warm hats, mittens, gloves, and scarves for donation to Oneonta Family Service Association. These donations can be put in the basket on December 7 through December 28. They will be delivered to Family Services at the beginning of the New Year.

To send our help even farther in our world, your family can choose presents (and muffins!) from the Mali Market available during coffee hour from December 7 through December 21. All proceeds benefit Youchaou's School in Bamako, Mali. Our UUSO Mali Task Force has recently raised money to build a library for the school that has almost been completed. The next focus will be to purchase books for the library.

The Unitarian Universalist Service Committee has a "Guest at Your Table" program that has been very accessible and meaningful for families for 40 years. To get started check out:

According to the website, this year's theme is: "...food sustainability: ensuring that people have sufficient, affordable, healthy, and culturally appropriate food to eat and that it's produced in a way that doesn't damage the environment... educational materials highlight projects in Haiti, Kenya, and Honduras that illustrate how sustainability initiatives, when done well, have multiple benefits." You can download a booklet called Our Stories of Hope that highlights "economic justice, educational opportunities for children, community responses to climate change, and other advancements for human rights." For many years my own family had a "Guest at Your Table Box" as a part of our dinnertimes together during the holidays. The box had photos and descriptions of children who would benefit from our donations. We would add small change to the box and it felt like we were

inviting these children to have a place at our table. The UUSC no longer produces these boxes but I would encourage you to make a box together and for it to have a place of honor at your table. I will leave some blank box forms near the Mitten Basket at the back of the sanctuary should you want to make and decorate your own box.

These are a just a few of the opportunities available for helping others during this season. I know your children will have many other ideas and that it would make for quite an interesting discussion!

I wish you and your family a season of grace, justice, and beauty.


