

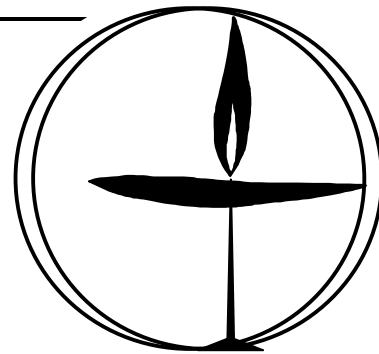

BICENTENNIAL OF REV. CHAPIN'S BIRTH

You may have heard the same stories I have about Edwin Chapin's visit to Oneonta—the famed minister having to enter through a window the crowd was so large and it being no easy chore since he was not a small man, so I figured there would be a big article—it must have been big news, right? But there was nothing on the front page. Hmm. On page 4 of the January 31, 1879, *Oneonta Herald and Democrat*, appeared an article entitled "The New Church." It's four paragraphs long, and the only mention of Chapin reads, "Rev. Dr. Chapin preached yesterday afternoon and not half the people who desired to hear him could do so." Over the three-day celebration, the "attendance of laymen from the villages and neighboring towns, has been quite large." The article closes, "Other denominations have shown the Universalists perfect courtesy, and as there is always room for one more, we have no doubt the pleasant relations among churches in Oneonta will hereafter be added to by our friends of 'liberal belief.'" Oh, and the front page story that week? "The Pit and the Pendulum" by E.A. Poe. In its entirety

PS: Contrary to the information in the December 3 newsletter article, Rev. Chapin was born in Union Village, now Greenwich, in Washington County.

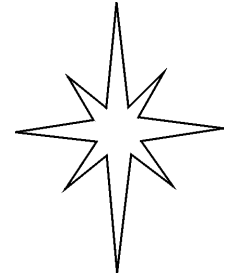

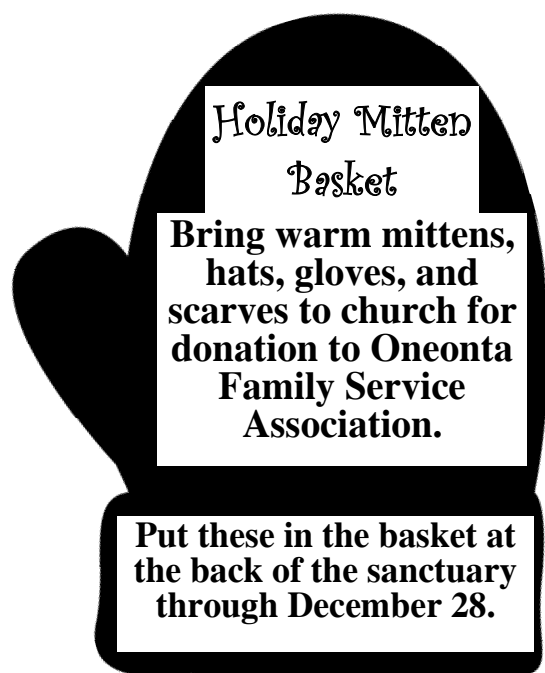

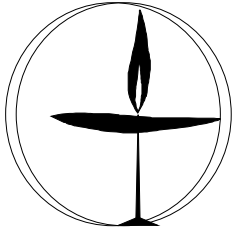
