

SAWDUST FROM THE BOARD

The Board of Trustees met on 6/28/17. After reviewing minutes and reports, we further explored a governance model based on the book "Governance and Ministry" by Dan Hotchkiss in which the Board oversees the committees that sustain the Society and the Minister oversees the groups that promote the ministry of the Society. We discussed its potential to better serve UUSO toward furthering its Mission.

We reviewed the results of the Assessment of our Ministry and acknowledged some progress with our focus on multigenerational activities. We saw that the congregation also wants to improve our volunteer strength. Rev. Craig emphasized that what we call "volunteering" is really what we do "in service" of our mission which lends deeper meaning and significance. This will be a focus of the Board thanks to congregational input. Following the regular meeting, we held a special meeting to elect officers. Karen Palmer continues to be President, Amy Forster Rothbart is Vice President, and Stan Maricle is the Clerk.

We also met on July 28, 2017 with new Trustees Nathan Elsener and Adrienne Martini and new Board member and Moderator, Mary Ruhoff. During this meeting the Board reviewed its foundational mission and principles included in the Leadership Covenant and BOT job description. We set the board calendar for the year and agreed upon October 15, 2017 for the Fall Congregational Meeting and May 6, 2018 for the Annual Congregational Meeting.

In addition, we assigned BOT liaisons to committees. We have decided to experiment with the new governance model by agreeing that Rev. Craig will oversee several "teams" related directly to ministry. These are: Social Action, Special Events, Worship, Music, Pastoral Care, and Membership which is assuming a new name of "Welcoming" team. The Trustees will continue to have liaisons to all other committees. We will continue to monitor and evaluate this model throughout the coming year. The Board liaisons are as follows:

UUSO POLICIES

It is the practice of this Society to publish all policies in the Newsletter. Here are a few from our archives that haven't been publicized. (some formats may have been changed for better fit.) You can find all UUSO Policies created by the Board of Trustees on our website, under the Member's Documents section.

Bulletin Board, UUSO Policy

September 21, 2016

The bulletin boards located at Chapin Memorial, 12 Ford Avenue (one inside the sanctuary, one in the outside entryway), are intended to be means of communication for the UUSO community. The Office Administrator is responsible for maintaining the bulletin boards and ensuring that all postings follow this policy.

Sanctuary Bulletin Board

The sanctuary bulletin board is for posting:

- Worship service announcements
- Denominational information
- UUSO events and information
- Articles about/by UUSO Members and Friends
- Correspondence intended for the UUSO community
- Notices of community events
- Offers of services or goods from Members or Friends

All items posted on the sanctuary bulletin board must be signed and dated by the poster. Only the Office Administrator (or other UUSO staff) may remove items that are not signed, are no longer relevant, or have been posted for an excessively long time. The sanctuary bulletin board will be kept closed during worship services and ceremonies. No one may post items on the exterior of the bulletin board (visible when the bulletin board is closed), except that a group renting or using CM may post things on the exterior surface only during their event. Chairs are not to be stacked in front of the bulletin board.

Outside Bulletin Board

The outside bulletin board is for posting:

- Sunday schedule of events at UUSO
- Weekly schedule of events at UUSO
- Religious Education Sunday programming & information
- Upcoming Events at / for / by UUSO

The outside bulletin board will be kept locked. The Office Administrator, Minister, and Director (s) of Religious Education will have keys to the bulletin board. As a public bulletin board, the outside bulletin board will be kept uncluttered and up-to-date. Nothing is to be posted on the glass (inside or out) of the bulletin board. Items may be submitted for posting to the outside bulletin board by giving them to the Office Administrator or by putting them in the UUSO office mailbox (located in the foyer of 12 Ford Avenue).

UUSO POLICIES

Animals, UUSO Policy

November 18, 2015

No animals will be allowed in any UUSO buildings except for:

- 1. Service/Companion/Assistance Animals required due to a disability.
- 2. Certified Therapy Animals with prior approval of a UUSO staff member.
- 3. Animals being used as part of a worship or R.E. program.

Reasoning: Under ADA guidelines, service animals (also known as Companion animals and Assistance animals) are not required to be trained or certified. The only requirements are that the animal be required due to a disability, be under control of the owner, and be house trained. Animal owners can only be asked if the animal is required for a disability, but may not ask what the disability is. Other federal guidelines make allowances for companion animals and assistance animals—again, with the condition that that the animal is required by the person to function normally in that space. Not all service animals are certified nor have they all received special training, so this isn't a condition we can require.

Therapy animals are NOT protected by ADA or other federal laws. These animals are specially trained and certified to be able to visit schools, hospitals, nursing homes, and trauma sites. Owners of therapy animals are required by the certifying agency to follow strict procedures and guidelines-- including asking for permission before bringing an animal on-site.

Privacy Policy January 18, 2017

Directory

- 1. The UUSO Directory is for distribution to members and friends of the UUSO. Copies of the Directory are to be given to new members. Friends of the congregation may receive a copy of the directory at the discretion of the UUSO Office Administrator. With the exception of single copies at each telephone at 12 and 16 Ford Avenue, the Directory is not to be made available for general public use.
- 2. Information in the Directory, including postal and e-mail addresses, is not to be used for Non-UUSO purposes. Information from the Directory may be provided to members and friends of the Society. Requests by others for Directory information about UUSO members and friends are to be handled with discretion.
- 3. The on-line directory is to be in a password protected area.

Non-Directory Information

- 1. Non-directory information about UUSO members and friends should not be given out without a verbal release from the member or friend.
- 2. Non-directory information on children, including health information or other information kept by the Director(s) of Religious Education, is confidential. Inquiries about such matters are to be referred to the Director(s) of Religious Education and shared with others only on a need-to-know basis.
