

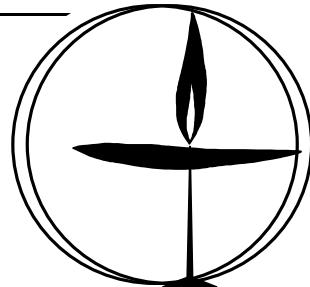

WHAT WE CAN ACHIEVE TOGETHER

As you know, the Stewardship Committee has provided our congregation with a goal and a “stretch” goal for the 2016-17 campaign “Sound the Call, Lead the Way!” The Board of Trustees has reviewed the proposed budget at these goal levels and would like to inform the congregation what we can achieve over our previous year’s budget toward advancing our UUSO Mission, Vision, and Long Range Plan:

“Stretch” Goal of \$183K

- Provides the professional development support for our DRE to support us to move toward a “church for all generations”.
- Likewise, other staff will be better supported with professional development
- Social Justice goals are a large part of our Long Range Plan. Meeting this goal would allow the Social Action Committee and Anti-Racism Task Force to make a significant impact in the coming year
- Staff would finally get a well deserved 2% raise

Goal of \$180K

- Professional Development, the Social Action Committee, and the Anti-Racism task force would receive more than last year but less than requested.
- Once again, staff would only get a 1% raise. Achieving our Mission is becoming more dependent on the excellent work of our staff. At some point, giving our staff a lower raise than deserved becomes a justice issue that we own.

Thank you to all who have pledged or will be pledging generously to support the our Mission!

- Approved a building rental exception

DINING FOR WOMAN - SUNDAY, APRIL 17; 6:00pm

The Oneonta Chapter of Dining for Women will have its next potluck dinner on Sunday, April 10, at a new time: 6:00 pm in the UU sanctuary. Each month the group learns about and supports organizations that help women and girls in developing countries improve their lives.

The featured organization this month is Hands in outreach. For 25 years this program has supported education opportunities for poor girls from the slums of Kathmandu, Nepal. Their mothers are often single, illiterate, have little standing in their communities and work at medial jobs. Be Part of Her Dream is a pilot project to teach these women basic literacy, simple computer skills, and financial planning. they will receive a stipend to help cover lost wages while they attend classes and to help them begin saving for the future.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS

Sunday, March 27th was our traditional Spring Can Hunt and Celebration. People from our congregation donated many cans which were then hidden in the backyard of the Olympia Brown House. the children found a total of 78 cans which they stacked, counted, bagged and loaded into the trunk of my car for donation to St. Mary's food Pantry of Oneonta. it was a slightly chily but beautiful and sunny day. This is a popular event that many look forward to during our Religious Education Year. We had delicious treats. Teagan and Aubrey brought us little rice crispy-treat birds' nests that each contained small candy eggs. We also had strawberry shortcakes.

We created quite amazing frogs (and other creatures) from pompoms and googly eyes. The frog theme was yet another reminder of the "Frog Mindfulness Practice" that we have been working on this spring.

Mindfulness practice provides tools for coping in an increasingly stressful world. it is something children can choose to practice inside themselves rather than being externally ordered to "chill" or to calm down. they learn to listen to their own rhythms and to pay attention to their own need for inner calmness. this is a powerful thing. UUSO Children and I have recently had two mindfulness lessons where we practiced being "Still like a frog." Our frog mindfulness practices are inspired by the book, [Sitting Still Like a Frog: Mindfulness Exercises for Kids \(and their Parents\)](#) by Eline Snel. I wrote more about this in the previous newsletter.

Last Sunday, while RE helpers were hiding cans, children's group talked about how being mindful can help us in our lives. We practiced listening to our breathing and then taking a "weather report" of how we felt inside ourselves at that minute. Was it sunny in there? Was it stormy, changeable or cloudy? the idea was just to notice. We didn't judge but we "took our inner temperature." We focused on our breathing for a bit. then we were done.

Taking these few minutes to focus on breath and to listen deeply is an easy thing to practice. It gets even easier to do the more we remember to do it. Our breathing becomes slower and deeper. Our bodies and minds calm down. anyone can do this

whenever they need to help themselves better experience a situation. We can use it to be more present and ready for whatever it is we are facing. Quieting our minds can help us be open to whatever there is to learn that is around us and to listen to each other. It can also just be a nice way of loving and honoring ourselves.

We had a lovely time together on Sunday! I am honored to know and work with our UU children. I learn much from them and I have so much fun. I am grateful for the support, presence, and wisdom of the other adults who work with me and the UUSO children. I am also grateful for all of you who give us things like cans whenever we ask! Many thanks to you all for what you share with us.

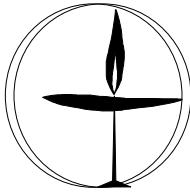
